



# Details of proposed program of work on licence

#### Year 1

- Consolidate database of pre-existing historical drilling, mapping and sampling. Update ranking
  of prospects/ targets based on a continued review of geological, geophysical and geochemical
  data compiled. There is a large dataset to assimilate and interpret.
- Complete on ground assessment and extend or conduct geochemical and or geophysical surveys to improve targeting of subsequent drilling.

#### Year 2

- Interpret geophysical data for drill targeting.
- First pass drill testing of best ranked targets and assess outcomes of drilling programs to design follow up drilling if warranted.

#### Year 3

Complete extension drilling to year 2 drilling if warranted.

#### Year 4

Complete extension drilling to year 3 drilling if warranted.

#### Year 5

Complete extension drilling to year 4 drilling if warranted.
